

# H.O.P.E.S. Kitchen Enlarges Its Mission and Outreach By: Cheryl Smith

There is a new HOPE for our community! For several years, our church has given away free lunches every Saturday to anyone who needs one - no questions asked. What began with an inspiration from our youth after an impactful mission trip in 1998 has bloomed into a weekly opportunity to minister to others through meals, showers (pre-COVID), prayer and fellowship. Volunteers prepare the meals with loving hands and they are welcomed by the homeless, the hungry, and sometimes, just those in search of community. This mission project was titled HOPES (Helping Other People Every Saturday) Kitchen, and has provided over 15,000 meals since its inception.

Last spring, the San Antonio Food Bank contacted us to see if we might help with monthly food distribution in Kerrville, to which we responded "Yes!" With ready volunteers, we have helped them distribute over 89,000 lbs of food, in our 8 months of operation! It has been a labor of love and another small step to relieve food insecurity in Kerr County.

With greater start-up costs for these Food Bank Markets and a shared mission to feed our community, it seemed natural that we combine these projects under one "umbrella" of funding and operation. So, on recommendation from the Benevolence and Outreach Committee and approval from Session, the program of "Hopes Kitchen" will now be expanded to cover all local hunger insecurity programs of our church, including the cooperative food distribution we have been doing with San Antonio Food Bank, and possibly other such projects in the future.

## **Blessing Bags**

As a special gift to our Hopes Kitchen customers on Saturdays - especially for those with no roof over their heads, we are starting a new project at Christmas to give them a backpack full of basic needs and supplies, such as water bottles, toiletries, warm gloves, socks, snacks etc. We will have these special gifts ready to distribute on Christmas and give them out through the holidays. To contribute to this effort, you can drop off your monetary contributions or the following items to the church.

- New socks (in packages, both men's and women's)
- Gloves or mittens
- Warm caps and scarfs
- Gently used coats (these won't go in the bags, but may be passed out, as needed)
- Small bottles of shampoo and body wash
- Small paperback books
- Small personal size tissue packets
- Small personal size sanitizer bottles or wipes
- Small flashlights
- New deodorant sticks (men's and women's)
- New lip balm
- Granola or other snack bars
- Meat sticks or nuts (individually wrapped)
- Quart and Gallon size Ziplock baggies

Although Hopes Kitchen does not have a specific budget, it operates on a designated fund with gifts placed for it directly. To keep this special mission serving the hungry and homeless in our community, please consider a special contribution to the church, marked with "Hopes Kitchen" on the memo. PNC is still hard at work, even as Christmas approaches, searching for your next long-term Pastor. To date we have received and carefully reviewed some three dozen Personal Information Forms from prospective candidates either matched by the computer in Louisville, recommended by someone, or who have initiated contact themselves. We have narrowed that list down to about seven prospects that we think could be a good fit for our congregation.

In that narrowing process we have not only thoughtfully read and discussed each of the six-page PIF's in detail, but the entire committee individually has reviewed one or more of the video sermons available online for each candidate. Our next step will be to schedule initial Zoom interviews with some or all of those 7 prospects sometime in January. After that we will be able to consider having face to face interviews with the candidate(s) that still interest us most and seem to be the best match for our particular congregation of hopeful believers.
