

Recently, your Session, through its Planning & Training Committee, updated our Manual of Standards of Procedure (SOP), which sets forth the program of Worship and Work of our congregation un-

der the leadership of the Session. These were updated, reaffirmed, and approved in late 2022. The Manual covers much of the activity of our church, Session, Deacons, Trustees and staff. Many elements of the SOP are derived from the Book of Order, Part II of the Constitution of PC(USA). We have not listed them, because your elders want to encourage those who are not currently serving with any of these mission teams to consider volunteering. We want all to find ways to contribute to our worship and work.
