

June 11-16, Dallas Mission Trip –Youth Mission Co is where mission, creativity, and transformation are happening with young people. We understand **mission** as God's call in the lives of all people to seek justice, love kindness, and walk humbly in faith. We see **creativity** as a tool of understanding and growth because it gets us outside of ourselves and in connection with the Spirit. We know **transformation** to be a lasting change. Our youth will go to Dallas, TX, to serve alongside First Presbyterian Dallas' outreach, The Stewpot and other organizations working with those who are living on the margins of a large urban center. They will learn about food insecurity, poverty, homelessness, and the changing dynamics of gentrification in Dallas.

July 10-15, SYNOD Youth Workshop - Synod Youth Workshop is a conference like no other. A place to receive and share the Good News of Jesus Christ with one another, with the community of Tulsa, OK, and ultimately with the world. Our youth will gather with highschoolers from across Synod of the Sun. This week will be filled with keynote addresses, small group discussions, service projects in Tulsa, worship, and play.

July 23-27, Camp Eagle - Overnight summer camp located in Rocksprings, TX, inspires Christ-like change through outdoor adventure, authentic relationships, and biblical truth. Our middle schoolers will take on seriously BIG adventures and spiritual growth while making unforgetting friendships under the mentorship of the inspiring Camp Eagle staff. Each day there will the keynote messages, bible study, small group discussions and high adventure activities.
