

# **Summer Camp Opportunities for Children**

Perhaps your child is old enough to go to camp this year! A church day camp offers a fun experience with more time to give spiritual input than Sunday morning. Children tend to blossom spiritually in this context. This summer we have several camp opportunities for your children to try.

Mo-Ranch and John Knox overnight camps: As a child grows older, sending them to an overnight Christian camp is a wonderful gift to them. Overnight camp is a big investment as camps are not inexpensive, but the benefits are immense. Plus, our church has a camps and conference fund that will reimburse you for one half of the cost of a week of camp at Mo Ranch or John Knox.

FPCK Camps: Registration is underway for our fun summer programs that we are holding here at First Presbyterian Kerrville! Please see our website for the registration forms.

Vacation Bible School, from June 5-8, is open to all children who are going into kindergarten all the way up to those going into the sixth grade. We will be exploring the "I Am" Statements of Jesus using crafts, Bible stories, games, music and science. We will start with a light supper each night. Tell your friends about it! All are welcome!

Creative Camp is June 26-30th, open to children who are going into 2nd grade through those going into 6th grade. Our theme is "<u>Days of Creation</u>," and we have lots of fun projects planned. On Friday at noon, we will have an Art Show, and the whole church is invited to come see it.

In his book The God We Can Know, Rob Fuquay begins by telling his readers, "God wants to be recognized... God is not hiding. God doesn't avoid us. God wants to be known." Since the beginning of Creation, God has desired to be in relationship with all of creation, especially humans. Even when people turn away from God, God continues steadfastly in the desire for a relationship with all people. Through our summer camps at church, at John Knox and at Mo Ranch, it is our deepest desire that children everywhere will continue to grow closer to God.

# Pentecost Offering on May 28th

Last Sunday's remarkable Youth Worship, a vital and thought-provoking service, was the ideal reminder of the Pentecost special offering, whose focus is youth. A gift to the Pentecost Offering helps the church en-



courage, develop, and support its young people, and also address the needs of at-risk children. Forty percent of the Pentecost offering can be retained by individual congregations wanting to make an impact in the lives of young people within their own community. The remaining 60% is used to support children-at-risk, youth, and young adults through ministries of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. Traditionally, our congregational share has gone to support attendance at Triennium and youth service projects. Pentecost Sunday, May 28, is the traditional day for bringing gifts to this offering, but, of course, they are welcome at anytime during this season. First Presbyterian-Kerrville is historically a strong supporter of Pentecost. Let that tradition continue!
