## **Property:**

- ➤ A Task Force on Sanctuary security was formed to address security measures. It includes those from Property-Tommy Tait and Gary Crozier, those from Worship-Bruce Story and Linda Phillips, and those from Finance-David Williams and Steve Clyburn, and from Staff-Mary Stone. Tom Richardson will also serve. The first meeting will be June 27.
- Update on property projects: Completed installation of Light pole for Choir Room; All Sanctuary Doors have been refinished and replaced; Neal Courtyard fountain is near completion; Complete repainting of Church Office and Work Space is almost complete; New Pastor office is getting a facelift--Cleaning carpet and painting trim.

Additionally, Dr. Rigby will be the guest lecturer at Schreiner University's Purposeful Lives banquet on Saturday evening, September 17. The Centennial Committee will recommend to the session a member or member couple to be recognized that evening for having led a purposeful life. All members of FPC-Kerrville will be invited to the banquet.

**Pastor's Report:** Rev. Montoya referenced her written report of her activities. She also commended to the session the outstanding job being done by all of the staff to prepare the office area, as well as all their other duties, for the arrival of the new pastor.

**Business of Church Councils:** Report of Commissioners to the June 16-17, 2023, stated meeting of Mission Presbytery to be held in San Antonio, TX @San Pedro Pres:

- Our own Fred Gamble moderated the meeting.
- COM recommended an alternative exegesis exam for a candidate, which was approved.
- The new Connect, Serve, and Learn Committees took written surveys.
- Approved an overture from University-Austin to amend the *Book of Order* Section F-1.0403 and G-2.0104b, adding categories to which the PCUSA does discriminate. This will be sent to the 226<sup>th</sup> General Assembly in 2024.
- Interesting reports from Evangelist in the Valley, Puentes de Cristo, Youth Connection, John Knox Ranch, and Austin Seminary

The following items were acted upon and approved:

- **Children's Ministry:** Approved an all-church hot-dog lunch in FLC following 11:00 worship on Sunday, August 13, 2023, in honor of all those going back to school.
