 Dinner returned and provides
 fellowship for about 100 people
 every month.
- The Youth continue to invite their friends to church and activities.
 They participated in 3 summer camps. They lead worship once a month.
- Children Ministries has seen an increase in families engaging with the church through summer camps, Sunday school and worship, and fellowship activities.

To maintain our current operations, ministries, and personnel, FPC hopes to receive \$900,000 in pledges for 2024.


