Friendship Bible Study, Ryan Hall- Romans, a Continuation - Most Biblical scholars would agree that Paul's letter to the young Christian community in Rome is the apex of Paul's theological thought. Scholars also seem to agree that the high point, or summit, of this theological thought process is contained in what was later labeled as "Chapter 8." As one Bible study leader once expressed, a good way to better understand Christian thought is to read Romans 8, eight times! We will therefore resume our study of the Book of Romans with Chapter 8. We are the Friendship Bible Study, where no one is a stranger for long. We will gather in Ryan Hall at 9:30am on Sunday mornings for coffee fellowship, with class beginning at 9:45. Please consider joining us.

Highlights from the Gospel of John, led by Eldon Sheffer, Room 204: The gospel of John is thought to have been written last, written as an eye witness, and containing a large amount of material found in no other gospel. During this seven week class we will consider passages from this unique document seeking new insights into the person of Jesus. As recorded in this gospel, Jesus said: I am the bread of life; I am the light of the world; I am the good shepherd; I am the resurrection and the life; I am the way, the truth, and the life; I am the true vine and my Father is the gardener; I am the vine, you are the branches. While the class will move through the gospel in sequence, individuals are encouraged to come to any individual class as they are able.

Return of The Wired Word—2024, led by Sonny Payne, Room 208: For those of you who have not encountered The Wired Word before now, it is a curriculum of study relating scripture to current news events. Every week the WW editorial board prepares a Christian based interdenominational study guide that they distribute on Thursdays for the following Sunday School classes.
