Midweek Manna Fall Bible Study Series

For our Wednesday night series this Fall, we will dive deeper into the different stages of faith following the book of Job. Our program will start at 5:30 p.m. with dinner provided and conclude by 6:50 p.m. in Ryan Hall. Various speakers will share their testimonies while guiding these conversations at our tables. We will also have music, prayers, and moments of meditation. Children are welcome to stay using crafts/activities at our tables, or we will have child-care available.

One of the biggest misconceptions about faith is that it is a trajectory, meaning that from one particular place, one's faith can move upwards to another level to produce a stronger, more fruitful, and more stable relationship with God. While that may happen to some of us, the truth is that faith is much more complex than that.

Since faith is deeply grounded in our relationship with God, we must treat it like any other relationship. There are some joyful, full of adventure, life-giving days. But there are also moments of despair, pain, and disappointment. All of those moments and experiences of faith can be true simultaneously. The Book of Job will provide us with the appropriate words, thoughts, and theological statements for this Fall series. Journey with us as we explore our faith together.
